

Process Update



Strategic Planning Process

Systems Change

March - May

 Based on the North Star and Audacious Goal, we aligned on a preliminary definition of systems change—and F5CA's role within it—with the Commission and leadership team

Target Outcomes

June - August

 In close partnership with F5CA's leadership team, we are developing draft target outcomes for each of F5CA's roles (i.e., catalyst, convener, broadcaster, advocate)

Draft Framework

August - October

- We will present a draft organizing framework for the strategic plan to the Commission in August
- Based on that initial input, we will refine the framework and develop a full draft in October

Develop Plan

November – January

 We will iterate on a complete draft of the strategic plan with the leadership team until we are ready to share a final draft for approval with the Commission in January 2025

Equity Trainings

July – February

- Catherine Goins from WestEd will lead staff through a series of four customized trainings on concepts of equity
- Trainings will build on Catherine's past work with F5CA

Equity Statement

May - October

 Based on input from the Commission, we are drafting and will iterate on a publicfacing statement that speaks to F5CA's commitment to equity—and provides concrete actions and goals in service of that commitment

Internal Needs Assessment

October – November

 We will design and administer a survey to assess what trainings and resources might be needed to deliver on F5CA's strategic plan


Develop Operational Plan

December – January

 To support F5CA in executing on its new strategic plan, we will codify any important operational considerations and develop a high-level implementation roadmap for staff to follow

Proposed Organizing Framework

Key Assumptions:

- 1. The four-year goals we've proposed are very much in draft stage. We expect to refine them further with input from F5CA leadership, staff, and partners.
- 2. Some of the investments and activities we've listed in the framework are confirmed while others are likely to be subject to further refinement or reshaping.
- 3. We are not yet ready to discuss outcomes and indicators at this stage but plan to develop a manageable set with F5CA leadership and staff.

Discussion Questions:

- Which elements of the framework resonate? Which do not?
- Are we aligned on the idea of organizing the strategy according to F5CA's different roles?
- Are we aligned on the level of specificity in the subgoals?
- What would you like us to keep in mind as we start to articulate outcomes and indicators?

Key Assumptions:

- Based on feedback from the Commission, we plan to engage a subset of the organizations Arabella spoke with as part of our organizational assessment of F5CA in 2022.
- We are working with the Executive Committee to determine which 8 – 10 organizations to engage.
- We can be flexible about when and how we engage stakeholders.

Discussion Questions:

- 1. When in our process would it make the most sense to engage external stakeholders? Earlier on when there is potentially more room to shape the final plan? Or later on when there will more for partners to review and their feedback can be more targeted?
- 2. How would you advise us to engage external stakeholders? We can meet individually with organizations, facilitate small focus group conversations, collect feedback through an online survey, or employ a combination of methods.
