
Priority areas were developed for the 2020-2025 Strategic Plan through Partner, Public and Commission Input.

Background

Overview

First 5 Modoc provides direct and indirect services to children birth through five and their families. Programs are implemented in partnership with local organizations seeking to provide equitable access to services for culturally, ethnically, and linguistically diverse communities (F5M, 2021).

History

First 5 Modoc was created through the statewide voter-passed initiative, Proposition 10. The tax-based funding seeks to promote, support, and improve the early development of children birth through age five (CCFC, 2021). Small County Augmentation funds have provided a fiscal floor for our agency to provide these services since the early 2000s.



Investments

Since 2000, First 5 Modoc has invested over \$7.9 million in local programs and projects to benefit children and families.






Systems Change

In January 2020, the First 5 Modoc Commission recognized the community-wide need for an "opendoor" direct service model to provide a centralized access point for resource connection, outreach, community events, education, family engagement, fund leveraging, and community advocacy.





This continuous systems investment is called the First 5 Modoc Early Learning & Resource HUB. The HUB provides access to all families and providers of children age prenatal through five through outreach events, partnership engagements, and educational activities.
